Through contemplating how the ICJ works, we can recognize the rare combination from which it was built up. In fact, unlike any other organ of the United Nations, the ICJ enjoys the ultimate power. However, it remains a glorous house of fairness; especially that in OISMUN there is no terrorization, no security council that has the ability to veto decisions of the court. The world we're living in nowadays is a ruthless one and finding an agent not abusing its power instead of dedicating all the needed tools in order to apply justice, is progressively becoming so rare.
