

# The annexation of Crimea and the East Ukrainian conflict Resolution

*par* Security Council

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**Topic:** The annexation of the Crimea and the East Ukrainian conflict

**Committee:** Security Council

**Main submitter:** United States of America

**Co-submitters:** Argentine Republic, Commonwealth of Australia, French Republic, Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, Republic of Lithuania.

**Signatories:** The Republic of Iraq, the Republic of Korea, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, the Republic of Turkey .

*Deeply disturbed* by the deaths and casualties caused by the annexation of Crimea,

*Pointing out* that the annexation of the Crimea is illegal according to international law and the vote of the UN General Assembly,

*Deeply convinced* that a country's sovereignty and territorial rights should be respected,

*Deeply conscious* of the importance of the strategic location of Crimea towards the Russian Federation such as the access to the naval base at Sevastopol, home to Russia's Black Sea Fleet,

*Keeping in mind* that the main mission of the UNSC according to the United Nations Charter is to maintain peace,

*Noting* the resolution adopted by the General Assembly 68/262, which clearly states that, all countries should refrain from recognizing any change in status of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea,

*Reminding* all delegations of the great efforts exerted by the Security Council and the UN as a whole to reach a peaceful solution to the crisis,

*Fully believing* in the co-operation of the honorable delegations of the UNSC, to find a peaceful solution to this crisis and a future that will include: peace, stability and unity,

*Reminding* that the United Nations approved the resolution calling Russia's Crimea annexing illegal,

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1. **Wishes** the cooperation of the Russian Federation and all members in this Council to find peaceful and logical solutions regarding the Crimean issue;
2. **Calls upon** the preservation of Russian-Ukrainian economic relations, including defense-industry cooperation in view of the implementation of the EU-Ukraine Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area (DCFTA);
3. **Recommends** the deployment of UN Peacekeepers in the Eastern Ukrainian region and the Crimea to assist in preserving peace, and to monitor the area;
4. **Demands** the banning of any future referendum on the status of Crimea and declaring that any decisions should only be taken by the Ukrainian government:
  - a) As it is the property of the Ukrainian government,
  - b) As a sign of respect towards Ukraine's sovereignty
5. **Urges** all countries to respect Ukraine's territorial integrity and sovereignty;

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6. **Reaffirms** that the annexation of the Crimea is illegal according to international law and therefore, the referendum shall and will not be recognized as it is a violation of Ukraine's sovereignty;
7. **Requests** that all seized buildings in the Crimea to be evacuated and cleared from any armed forces, this shall be monitored by the United Nations:
  - a) As it will be under the supervision of the UN Peacekeepers, which shall report to the UNSC monthly,
  - b) If no action has taken place severe financial sanctions shall take place;
8. **Emphasizes** the need for compensation for the damage caused through this time period by the Russian Federation;
9. **Invites** both parties concerned to an open dialogue to help de-escalate tensions between both countries, and to find opportunities for peace and stability in the future;
10. **Reminds** all States that any attempt to violate Ukraine's sovereignty will result in international bans and sanctions;
11. **demand**s the return of humanitarian assistance for refugees and internally displaced persons (IDPs);
12. **Authorizes** the deployment of Russian troops in Crimea under these conditions:
  - a) The Russian Armed Forces are only allowed to deploy 32,000 troops all in all:
    - i) 26,000 navy forces,
    - ii) 4,000 ground forces,

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- iii) 2,000 air forces that are situated at the two air bases Kacha and Gvardeysky, Located in Crimea
- b) The formation of allied forces and an agreement between Ukraine and Russia to reduce tensions:
  - i) This shall be monitored by the UNSC by the deployment of UN peacekeepers,
  - ii) These forces shall report monthly to the UNSC,
  - iii) According to if peace is sustained or not, the UNSC shall decide on the period for the deployment of these forces ,
  - iv) The UN Peacekeepers shall be deployed for a minimum of six months,
- c) All authorization to the use of force by the Russian armed forces shall be decided on by the Ukrainian government;

13. **Expresses its hope** that Ukraine and the Russian Federation reach a common interest and trade agreement, to insure that all relations between both parties will become stronger;

a) Trusts that all countries shall work together with great effort to make sure that a peaceful agreement shall take place to solve the crisis;

14. **Assures** that if all operative clauses are followed by the Russian Federation, all sanctions shall be lifted;

15. **Affirms** that any violation of the agreements set above shall be met:

- a) By financial and economic sanctions,
- b) By severe military actions.

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15. **Decides** to remain actively seized on the matter.
